Executive Order 14096 Implementation

EJ Strategic Plans: By October 2024, and every 4 years thereafter, agencies much submit to CEQ and publish online an EJ Strategic Plan that:

- Sets forth the agency's vision, goals, priority actions, and metrics to address and advance EJ and to fulfill the directives of this order.
- Identify and address opportunities to improve accountability and compliance with any statue the agency administers that affects health and environment of communities with environmental justice concerns.

EJ Assessment: Within two years of Plan submission, agencies will submit to CEQ and make public, an EJ Assessment that evaluates, based on CEQ Guidance, the effectiveness of the agency's Plan that includes and evaluation of the agency's Plan implementation, barriers to implementation, and steps taken to address them.

US DOT developed *Promising Practices for Meaningful Public Involvement in Transportation Decision-Making* to help funding recipients meaningfully involve the public in various stages of transportation decisionmaking and build their organizational capacity to do.

Public involvement from the beginning and throughout a project's lifecycle has the potential to help projects come to life faster and to better meet the needs of the community. This document provides a shared definition of meaningful public involvement and promising practices to help address barriers to inclusion in transportation decision-making.

Justice 40

WHAT is Justice 40?

President Biden's Jan 2021 EO14008: Tackling Climate Change at Home and Abroad created the government-wide Justice 40 Initiative, establishing the goal that at least 40% of the benefits of certain federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities.

WHY Justice 40?

Justice 40 aims to address decades of systemic inequitable historical policies and underinvestment in disadvantaged communities. The initiative aims to bring resources to communities most impacted by climate change, pollution, and environmental hazards.

What Justice 40 means for the US Department of Transportation (USDOT)

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and the Inflation Reduction Act represent once-in-a-generation investment in infrastructure, climate resilience, and innovation. Justice 40 allows USDOT to identify opportunities and prioritize projects that benefit rural, suburban, tribal, and urban communities facing barriers to affordable, equitable, reliable, and safe transportation. DOT will also assess the negative impacts of transportation projects and systems on disadvantaged communities and will consider if local community leaders have been consulted in a meaningful way during the project's development.

OVERVIEW: USDOT creates the first-of-its-kind transportation-specific tool, harnessing the latest census tract data across federally available data sources to provide users a centralized, easy-to-use platform that creates visibility into drivers of transportation disadvantage.

KEY FEATURES & DATA



Transportation-specific disadvantage index

Incorporates 40+ data elements across 5 categories of disadvantage: Transportation Insecurity, Health Vulnerability, Climate/Hazard Risk Component, Environmental Burden, Socioeconomic Vulnerability



Transportation Insecurity & Access Tool (TIAT)*


Visually displays the raw data for a select group of indicators related to **cost**, **access**, **and safety** at the state or national level, that reflect transportation insecurity.

Latest Census Tracts



Incorporates 2020 U.S. Census Tracts and data from sources including NOAA, USDOT, FEMA, EPA, Census Bureau, BIA, MRLC, DHS, CDC, DOI, and Esri.
